Dear Friends,

As we reflect on 2022, we are just so incredibly thankful for the community of people who have risen up in support of Jacaranda Housing's mission. We have been blessed by our dedicated volunteers, donors, board members, and staff who have all helped us grow into a place where we can start serving young adults who are at risk of homelessness.

In early 2022, Jacaranda Housing was able to launch our Outreach Program by holding job skills workshops and budgeting workshops through our partnership with the Village Family Services' Drop-in Center in North Hollywood and the Landing in Burbank. Through the generosity of our volunteers and donors, not only did we launch our workshops, but we also grew them and adapted them to be even more effective in teaching these young adults essential life skills.

We have also been able to serve young adults at the Landing through providing them with birthday gifts and homemade desserts for their birthdays each month through our Outreach Program. This beautiful partnership allows us to show this community of young adults that they are not forgotten and that they are cared for and thought about on their special day.

Another huge accomplishment in 2022 was that we were able to partner with a local Burbank family to secure a lease on a 3 bedroom 2 bathroom home for our Residential Program! We are extremely grateful for this partnership and for the influx of in-kind and monetary donations, so that we are able to furnish the house, making it into a home for the 6 young women that will be able to live there in 2023.

We hope that you enjoy learning more about the work that Jacaranda Housing is doing, the people doing the work, and the people who we are working to serve.

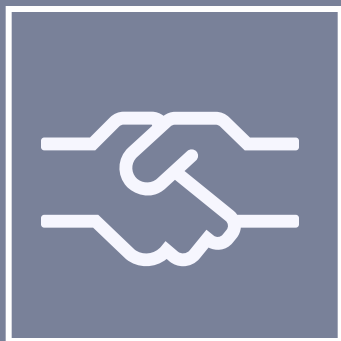
Residential Program
